

Statement of Deficiencies

1915.B.&C.: Health Services - Parental Notification

Not Met

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B. Reporting. Incidents, injuries, accidents, illnesses, and unusual behavior shall be documented and reported to the parent no later than when the child is released to the parent or authorized representative on the day of the occurrence.

C. Immediate Notification. The parent shall be immediately notified in the following circumstances:

1. blood not contained in an adhesive strip;
2. head or neck or eye injury;
3. human bite that breaks the skin;
4. animal bite;
5. impaled object;
6. broken or dislodged teeth;
7. allergic reaction skin changes (e.g. rash, spots, swelling, etc.);
8. unusual breathing;
9. symptoms of dehydration;
10. temperature reading over 101° oral, 102° rectal, or 100° axillary; or
11. injury or illness requiring professional medical attention.

Finding:

1915: B&C: Based on observations, interview and record review at 9:00 AM on 12/22/2020, center staff failed to have documentation of immediate notification to the parent when the following occurred to a child: On 12/1/2020, while under the supervision of S5 and S6, C1, age two-years-old, was playing with a cushion when he fell over it causing him to fall and hit his face on the floor at 10:30 AM. Initially, the only injury noticed was a busted lip; however, after lunch and nap time, S8 observed C1's tooth was chipped. Notification was made at 1:45 PM.

Corrective Action Plan: Effective 12/22/2020, S2 stated a verbal retraining was held with S5 and S6 regarding this incident to ensure this deficiency is not cited again.
