

Statement of Deficiencies

1901.M.: Strings and Cords

Not Met

1901.M.: Strings and cords, including but not limited to those found on equipment, window coverings, televisions and radios, shall be inaccessible to children under age 4.

Finding:

1901.M: Strings and Cords: Based on observations: Specialist observed on 12/27/2018 strings and cords were accessible to children under age 4 as Specialist observed in S8's classroom a phone being charged hanging off of a wall. The charger cord was accessible to the children who were under 4 in this classroom. S8 removed the charger cord during licensing inspection. The phone was not for S8, but for one of the after school children. S8 stated to Specialist that she had plugged in the phone charger for child.

1901.P.: Staff Personal Belongings

Not Met

1901.P.: The personal belongings of center staff members shall be inaccessible to children.

Finding:

1901.P.: Staff Personal Belongings: Based on observations: Specialist observed on 12/27/2018, the personal belongings of center staff members, S4 and S8, that were accessible to children. Specialist noticed S4's personal cellphone out and accessible to children. Specialist also observed S8's personal beverage on the table where the children were playing.

1909.G.: Infant - Bibs

Not Met

1909.G.: Bibs shall not be worn by any child while asleep.

Finding:

1909.G. Infant-Bibs: Based on observations: The provider allowed a bib to be worn by a child while asleep. Specialist observed on 12/27/2018 a child in S5's classroom sleep with a bib on. S2 removed the bib from the asleep child during licensing visit.

1909.I.: Availability of Safety Approved Cribs

Not Met

1909.I.: A safety approved crib shall be available for each infant.

Finding:

1909.I.: Availability of Safety Approved Cribs: Based on observations: S4 did not have a safety approved crib available for each infant, as 3 infants were in the room, but only two out of four beds were available during licensing visit.

1919.H.: Infants Held While Bottle Fed

Not Met

1919.H.: Infants that cannot hold a bottle shall be held while being bottle-fed. A child shall not be placed lying down on a mat or otherwise with a bottle, sippy cup, etc. A bottle shall not be propped at any time.

Finding:

1919.H. Infants Held While Bottle Fed: Based on observations: Specialist observed on 12/27/2018 during licensing visit, 1 out of 3 infants placed in a baby swing while being fed with a propped bottled.
